# Special Olympics North Dakota to be Represented at 2017 Special Olympics World Winter Games

The Special Olympics World Winter Games will return to Austria, host of the 1993 Special Olympics World Winter Games. The Games will be held from March 18-24, 2017. Three thousand athletes representing 100 nations will compete in nine sports during the week-long event with the Opening Ceremony in Schladming on March 18.

Four athletes from North Dakota have been selected to represent the U.S. after they complete the USA training camp in December. Athletes include Christy Coughlin, Minot-Alpine; Wade Wintermeyer, Jamestown-snowshoeing;

Dave Johs, Bismarck-Cross-Country Skiing; and Katielynn Ovitt, Bottineau-Alpine Skiing. Cindy Schopper of Valley City is an assistant snowshoe coach, Dr. Julie Blehm is on the Special Olympics USA medical team and Kathleen Meagher, SOND President and CEO is the Family Coordinator for Special Olympics USA.

# Truck Convoy Raises Funds for Special Olympics



82 trucks, everything from 18 wheelers, to tow trucks, to moving vans, all on one mission, joined together for the World's Largest Truck Convoy to raise awareness and funds for Special Olympics North Dakota on September 24<sup>th</sup>. Companies from across North Dakota and local law enforcement agencies joined together to raise more than \$18,000, convoying for 18 miles through the city streets of Fargo and West Fargo, making the 2016 Truck Convoy the biggest ever held in North Dakota. The "Lead Dog" Auction (the first position of the convoy), was won by Kyllo Trucking from Larimore, ND and the "Tail End" was won by Jim's Towing. In addition to the Convoy, a celebration was held at Jim's Towing on Friday evening, with events including a driver social and a truck light show at dusk. On

The amount of soccer teams changed with an increase from 21 teams to 28, which included a growth of 3 youth teams. Field size was also a change as the fields were made shorter, but within Special Olympics North America guidelines, to accommodate for more scoring in this year's tournament. This year, 418 athletes competed at the State Tournament at South Middle School in Grand Forks. Bismarck, Dickinson, Fargo (with team members from Casselton, Fargo, Moorhead, and West Fargo), Grafton, Harvey, Jamestown, Mandan, Minot, Valley City and Wahpeton made up the delegations that competed. Red River High School again played host to the evening meal and dance. 2016 NCAA Division I Men's Hockey champions from the University of North Dakota took the stage as escorts during the Opening Ceremony.
